

PASTOR'S CORNER

Wanna learn a cool new word? The word is "micromort."

A micromort is a unit of risk defined as a one-in-a-million chance of death. Micromorts can be used to measure riskiness of various daily activities. For instance, for my mini-vacation three weeks ago, my classmates and I traveled to Branson, Missouri, a distance of approximately 250 miles. Driving that far, one way, carried the risk of one micromort. So round trip would be two micromorts. Here is the crazy part of it: just living one day in 2010, without doing anything carried the risk of 20 micromorts. (8000 in a year)

Here are some risks involved with leisure activities and sports. Scuba diving: 5 micromorts per dive. Snow Skiing; 0.7 micromorts per day. Skydiving: 8 per jump. Base Jumping: 430 per jump. Climbing Mount Everest: 37,932 micromorts. (Stay home, on this one)

Travel: Each of these is one micromort: Walking 17 miles. Biking 10 miles. Driving 250 miles. Flying 6000 miles.

Chronic risks: add one micromort for: Drinking a half liter of wine, smoking 1.4 cigarettes, living two days in NYC, eating 100 charbroiled steaks, drinking Miami water.

Other activities: Hang gliding: 8 per trip. Giving birth: 120 micromorts

The point should be clear. Life always involves a bit of risk. Nothing is absolutely safe. Anything can be dangerous. Life is a tradeoff, willingness to do anything carries some risk.

Let's apply this to our current situation. We will do our part to make Holy Redeemer Church and School as safe as we can, but it will never be 100% risk free. Nothing is. Life is always a bit of a step into the unknown and risky, and each individual has to figure out for themselves how much of risk they are willing to take. You try not to take foolhardy risks (you may want to give up your dream of giving birth on Mount Everest), but you have to continue living your life taking calculated ones.

And that's why, whether you are a believer or not, you have to trust in God.

Attention Holy Redeemer Parish Volunteers: New System for Safe Environment Compliance



The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service.

For those who already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to the new system (if your class date does not transfer in, contact Laurie Medley in the parish office). In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Go to **www.preventandprotectstl.org** to register. **The passcode is stlprotect**.

Please contact Laurie Medley in the parish office (parishoffice@holyr.org or 314-962-0038) with any questions or for further assistance. It only takes about 30 minutes to fully complete all steps required to register and to be in full compliance in the new system.

Some have registered on the site and submitted a background check but have neglected to complete the other requirements. Here are the steps that everyone must complete:

- Register onto the site
- Submit New Background Check
- Complete "Protecting God's Children" training (For those in the old system, your class date should transfer in. If not please call or email and we can fix that)
- Complete "Mandated Reporter" training
- Complete "Code of Conduct" training
- Sign electronically the "Code of Conduct"


