

PASTOR'S CORNER

Tomorrow is the feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**. During these turbulent times, a reflection:

The word TRAVEL comes from the same root as the word TRAVAIL. When one travels, when one moves to a new place, when one ventures out of one's comfort zone to explore new things and new possibilities, there is always the possibility, if not the inevitability, of suffering and pain.

Life is hard. I am not saying that it has to be one long trudge for a few decades and then you die. (There is another saying similar to this.) No, life has joys and wonders and even delights and bliss. But don't kid yourself, there are a lot difficult things in life. Work, relationships, illness and ultimately death. But knowing that there are crosses to bear, makes bearing them a bit more do-able, just as denying them doesn't make them go away. As is becoming the theme of my life: **the more you focus on the easy and the effortless, the more problematic and harder your life actually becomes.** The journey, the way, the path will always have its difficulties.

That is why we are called to be people of endurance. I won't name names, but I have known, in each and every one of the parishes I had the privilege to serve; strong, sturdy, solid, tough people. I was awed by these people. They were people who were willing to take up their cross, of work, of illness, of family and follow in the footsteps of Christ up the hills of their personal Calvarys.

How did they do it? Simply put, they were people of vision. In a reflection on martyrdom an author wrote: Virtually every painting of someone being martyred has this motif, the martyr has his or her eyes lifted up towards heaven, in contrast to the eyes of the executioners and onlookers which are cast downwards in hatred, envy, and group-think or in the blank stare of mindlessness. People who are willing to take up their cross and follow in the footsteps of Christ, people of endurance, people who are not afraid of "the hard," are people of vision. They can see beyond their trials, beyond their suffering, beyond their ordeal. That's what keeps them going, that's what fuels their love, that's what helps them endure.

The lesson of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is a harsh lesson, to be sure, but it is a lesson that if learned, will reap a bounty of Life, of Hope, of Goodness, of Peace, of Joy.



Attention Holy Redeemer Parish Volunteers:

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service.

For those who already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to the new system (if your class date does not transfer in, contact Laurie Medley in the parish office). In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Go to **www.preventandprotectstl.org** to register. **The passcode is stlprotect**.

Please contact Laurie Medley in the parish office (parishoffice@holyr.org or 314-962-0038) with any questions or for further assistance. It only takes about 30 minutes to fully complete all steps required to register and to be in full compliance in the new system.

Some have registered on the site and submitted a background check but have neglected to complete the other requirements. Here are the steps that everyone must complete:

- Register onto the site
- Submit New Background Check
- Complete "Protecting God's Children" training (For those in the old system, your class date should transfer in. If not please call or email and we can fix that)
- Complete "Mandated Reporter" training
- Complete "Code of Conduct" training
- Sign electronically the "Code of Conduct"


