PASTOR'S CORNER

Let's talk about something uncomfortable from an article I just read:

A 2018 meta-analysis on sexting—the act of sending nude photos, videos or sexual messages—published in JAMA Pediatrics found that 1 in 7 adolescents have sent sexts, 1 in 4 have received sexts and 1 in 8 have forwarded sexts **without the consent** of the person in the photo. Many teens now think that sharing these kinds of pictures has become a prerequisite for dating, with girls feeling pressured to send photos.

Just so we are clear: it's illegal in many states for teens to have such photos on their phone, **even if the exchange was consensual.**

So what is a parent to do? Here is what the experts say (and I agree).

1. Start the conversation early. If your kids are still very young, say 10 and under, you can start having conversations about what healthy relationships look like, what consent means and how to be a good digital citizen—without ever mentioning sexting. As they get older you can get into all the particulars.

2. Make it about someone else. If you hear about or see a news article about a minor who has been charged with possession of these kinds of materials, use that as an opportunity to raise the issue. In about half the states, teens who engage in **sexting can be prosecuted and added to sex-offender registries.**

3. Do some role playing. Help your children imagine a scenario where they received a sext, or if someone pressured them to share one. You might want to do this before your child is put into a situation like that, especially if it is a face to face encounter. You and your child can also brainstorm ways to say no. Deflecting the request with humor is one way experts say kids might feel more comfortable.

4. Calm down. If you learn your child has been asking for or sharing nude photos, try to regain your composure before your talk. Your child will need guidance to sort all of this out and they do not need you freaking out.

5. Designate a proxy. If you don't have a great relationship with your teen or the conversation doesn't go well, you can suggest they talk about sexting with another adult with whom they feel comfortable. Maybe someone else can handle this situation in your stead.

6. Delete, delete, delete. If you discover that your children have inappropriate photos of themselves or of other minors on their phone, explain that the photos should be deleted **immediately.** Even selfies can be considered possession of child porn in some states.

Having been an administrator in a school (yes, even a Catholic school) I have had to deal with situations like this. (It wasn't fun.) Some young people don't understand that this is serious and could have lifelong implications for them. (Cyberspace is incredibly unforgiving.)

It is always good, for a variety of reasons, to remind ourselves that our bodies are temples of the Spirit, to be treated with dignity and honor.

A Message from the Archdiocese:

A decision has been reached regarding the date for the lifting of the dispensation of the faithful to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. **Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski is lifting the dispensation as of July 1, 2021.**

We understand that these continue to be uncertain times for everyone, and we want all to feel safe returning to Mass. **Please note that parishioners who are sick, homebound, immunocompromised and gravely concerned for their health retain the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass, which has always been the case in normal times.**

Additionally, the safe return of choirs, Holy Water in the Holy Water fonts, hymnals and missalettes in the pews and the usage of offertory baskets is now at the discretion of the pastor of each parish. **The distribution of the Chalice of the Precious Blood during Holy Communion remains prohibited until further notice from the USCCB.**

As a reminder, the archdiocese recommends that individuals who have not received a vaccine should follow CDC guidelines. **We ask that they be thoughtful of their own health and that of their community in monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms related to the use of masks and when it comes to social distancing.**

Masks remain optional for those who are fully vaccinated. Capacity restrictions and social-distancing measures at archdiocesan parishes are being determined by the parish pastor based on the size and construct of the parish, and what is needed to provide for the safest possible environment.



JESUS SAID TO JAIRUS,

MARK 5:36

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FAITH PRECEDES HEALING

As always on Sundays in Ordinary Time, the Old Testament reading illumines today's Gospel. In the longer form, Jesus performs two healings; and the Book of Wisdom proclaims our God the God of life, who “fashioned all things that they might have being” and formed human beings in “the image of his own nature,” to be “imperishable” (Wisdom 1:14; 2:23). People of faith, therefore, choose to live God's “undying justice (righteousness)” (1:15) in this mortal life, thus beginning, even now, the undying life for which we were created. To choose otherwise is to choose the other side: the devil and death (2:25). Mark presents the two healings as a story within a story, a “story sandwich,” a literary device that reinforces his message for those who originally would have heard, not read, the story. Mark wants to emphasize an essential truth of his Gospel: that Jesus does not perform miracles to compel faith, but rather that faith precedes healing.

JUST HAVE FAITH

Jairus' daughter is the child of an important, privileged man, who publicly seeks out Jesus and loudly proclaims—and demonstrates—his faith, “falling at Jesus' feet and pleading earnestly with him” (5:22–23). The anonymous woman virtually “sneaks up behind” Jesus and, though clearly filled with faith, keeps that faith to herself until Jesus draws “the whole truth” out of her after her cure (5:27–28, 33). All the more impressive, then, that Jesus delays his healing of the seemingly “more important” and younger woman for the unknown, truly marginalized older woman. Returning to the “domestic church,” so to speak, of Jairus' house from the public setting of the older woman's cure, Mark tells us that Jairus' daughter has died. In the face of a hopelessness even more definitive than that of the hemorrhaging woman, people tell Jairus “why trouble the teacher any longer?” (5:35). But Jesus does not consider his response to Jairus' faith hopeless or a bother: “Do not be afraid; just have faith” (5:36). Despite death's apparent triumph at Jairus' home, Jesus grasps the child's hand—even though the law prohibited touching the dead—and bids her, “Talitha koum—Little girl, I say to you, arise!” (5:41).

WHY BOTHER?

So Mark seems to be asking us: Like Jairus on his way home or like the woman after twelve years, will we wonder, why bother? Or keep walking in faith with Jesus? Is a silent touch of Jesus' garment—a quiet prayer of faith—enough for us? In the face of apparent hopelessness, will we choose faith over despair despite the ridicule of the crowd, remembering that Jesus has grasped us by the hand in baptism and commanded us to rise? Note the Gospel's ending: after bidding Jairus' daughter rise, Jesus commands that she be given something to eat (5:43). So, too, Jesus invites us now to feast at his eucharistic sacrifice and banquet!


