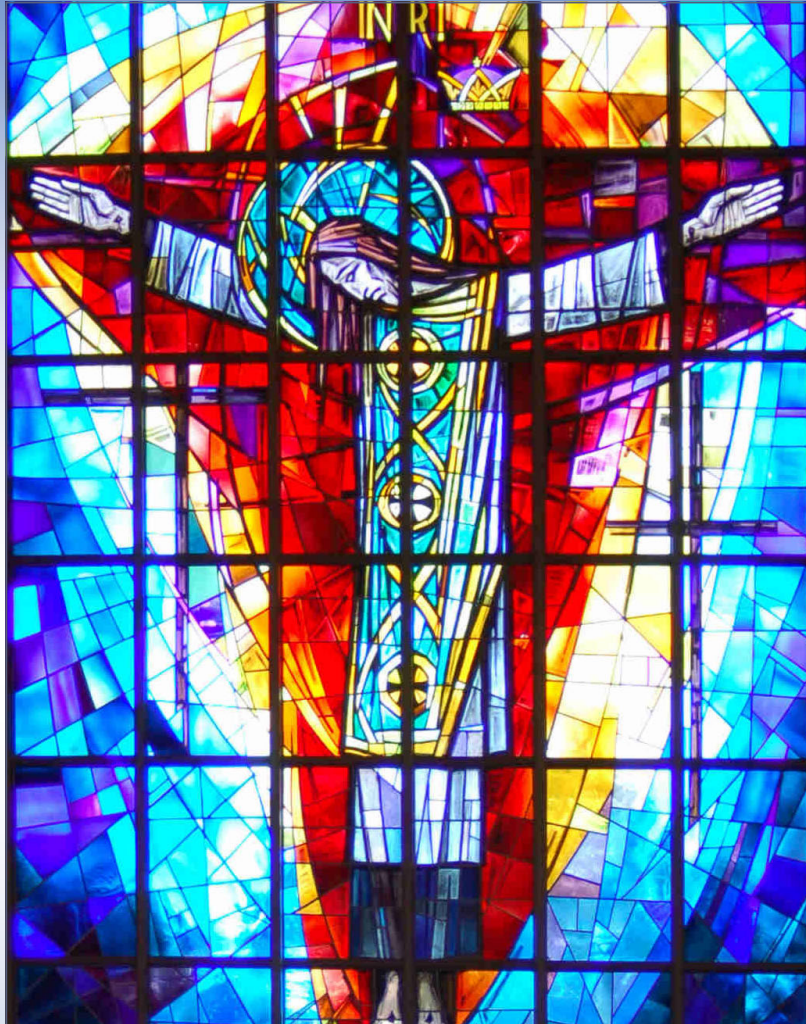

PASTOR'S CORNER

ODDS AND ENDS

Congratulations to our Sixth Graders who received their new Bibles at the Bible Mass last weekend. I gave them an assignment to ask various people what their favorite passage from the Bible is. That is a good thing for all of us to think about. Maybe come up with a Top Ten list of your favorites. And if you know a sixth grader, share that with him or her. I gave them their first one: Philippians Chapter 1. It was the reading that my mother chose for her own funeral.

*I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you,
praying always with joy in every prayer I utter for all of you,
because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now.*

I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus.

It is right that I should think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, you who are all partners with me in grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel.

For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus.

And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception,

to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ,

Actually, I prefer the translation: "to hold on to the things that really matter."

I would love for you to share with me your favorite passages of the Sacred Scripture.

It is a real joy to behold.

Basketball registration is now open. Late registration will not be available; enrollment closes on **October 16th** so we encourage you to register early. Please share this with any other family or friends within our Webster community who did not play basketball last season, but would like to join our 2023 season.

All special requests for the basketball season needs to be **included in your Team Sideline registration under the comments section**. Email requests will not be accepted. All player/team requests will be reviewed and we will do our best to accommodate, but are not promised. Each year, numerous players end up on a team that was not their request. This has many factors such as volunteer coaches, player enrollment, competitive tryouts (5th-8th grade only), etc.

UNIFORMS: 3rd and 4th grades Red, multi-sport Nike Dry-Fit jerseys will be utilized for basketball through 4th grade. Contributions to the HR Haiti Mission have enabled:

- Primary school education for ~ 400 students at St. Therese School and Harry Hosey School
- Post-secondary school scholarships for 21 students in the St. Jean du Sud area
- School lunches for ~ 200 students at Harry Hosey School (1)
- Subsidized health care program at the LSF clinic in nearby Ti Rivye (2)
- Clean water capacity for ~ 10,000 families (3)
- Operation of a year-round dental clinic
- Vocational school training for young women in St. Jean
- Provision of chickens, a female goat, training, and breeding services for 300 families (4)
- Financial support for parish operations
- Repairs to both the church and rectory following the August 2021 earthquake

Clean water is the foundation for health and food security in Haiti

In collaboration with *Water With Blessings*, the Holy Redeemer Haiti Committee sponsored a large village-to-village clean water mission in April-May 2022 to promote point-of-use Sawyer water filters and community education in water sanitation. WWB is a Louisville-based organization that operates in several developing countries, collaborating with local communities to improve access to clean water. Previously, we engaged with WWB to conduct our own small-scale clean water missions to train 180 "Water Women" in the use and maintenance of these durable water filters. Impressed with the hospitality and grass-roots organizing in St. Jean, WWB approached us about a large village-to-village campaign in the St Jean du Sud region, offering to pay for the filters and training if the HR Haiti Mission would cover the room & board for the trainers over a six-week period. Our successful 2021 Lenten Offering enabled that to happen. As a result, over 2700 water women were trained, equipped with the filtration equipment, and commissioned to share their filter with at least three other families. With an average family size of 5-6 people, this initiative has the potential to provide clean water access to ~60,000 people, many of them children who suffer greatly from water-borne illnesses. Surveys taken 3-4 months after the mission indicate lower levels of gastro-intestinal illnesses. This is a remarkable development for the communities in and around St. Jean du Sud and highlights the value of collaboration: for our ~\$12,000 investment, we were able to provide training and filters worth > \$162,000. A poster in the back of church provides an overview of the water mission.
