

PASTOR'S CORNER

We adore you O Christ and we bless you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.

One of the most stunning things about Holy Redeemer Church is that it is literally held aloft by the Stations of the Cross. In the morning and in the evening, the rising and setting of the sun blaze the power of Christ's sacrifice for us to bask in all its glory. I cannot tell you the number of times I have been enthralled in its beauty.

I have been blessed in my life to walk the actual Via Dolorosa, the Way of Sorrows, in Jerusalem. To actually carry a cross through the narrow passageways of the holy city was one of the most humbling and awe-inspiring moments of my life. As we passed the cross from pilgrim to pilgrim we all felt like Simon of Cyrene, and we carried that feeling home whenever we helped another who was suffer-

ing or aching. The Via ends, unsurprisingly, on the roof of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and you then walk down to the Hill of Calvary, the traditional site of the crucifixion. From there you see the place where the body was prepared for burial and then you see the place of the tomb, the Edicule (the Little House), the traditional

site of the resurrection. It is all quite stunning.

The history of the Way of the Cross, the Stations, is somewhat hazy. There is a tradition (which I would like to believe) that after Jesus' Death and Resurrection, his Mother Mary would visit the route he walked that fateful Good Friday. But there is very little evidence that the way of the Cross was an early devotion of the ancient church. As the centuries passed, there was a movement to replicate Jerusalem for Christians throughout the world. At the monastery of San Stefano at Bologna a group of connected chapels were constructed as early as the fifth century, by St. Petronius, Bishop of Bologna, which were

intended to represent the more important shrines of Jerusalem.

The earliest use of the word "Stations," as applied to the accustomed halting-places in the Via Sacra at Jerusalem, occurs in the narrative of an English pilgrim, William Wey, who visited the Holy Land in 1458 and again in 1462, and who describes the manner in which it was then usual to follow the footsteps of Christ in His sorrowful journey. It seems that up to that time it had been the general practice to commence at Mount Calvary, and proceeding thence, in the opposite direction to Christ, to work back to Pilate's house. By the early part of the sixteenth century, however, the more reasonable way of traversing the route, by beginning at Pilate's house and ending at Mount Calvary, had come to be regarded as the proper way.

Around the same time in Europe, places were set up to replicate the path of Jesus, even so

far as to set out the exact distance he walked. In time, there were several different devotions to the way and not all of them were delineated by FOURTEEN different Stations. By the nineteenth century it became common practice to erect the stations in churches and the devotion has remained ever since.



With all that being said, I wholehearted invite you to the Choral Way of the Cross this Sunday at 3 pm in our church. The choir from St. Francis Borgia Church will be singing and it should be a Way of the Cross like none other. Having read the narration that I will be vocalizing, it promises to be a powerful and spiritually enriching event. This is truly a special event and will kick start the final weeks of the Lenten season in a wonderful way.

LENTEN DEVOTIONAL CONCERT

The Choir of St. Francis Borgia Parish will offer a devotional concert, *The Way of the Cross*, on Sunday, March 26 at 3:00 PM at Holy Redeemer Church, 17 Joy Avenue in Webster Groves.

The Devotional Concert is based on the Stations of the Cross. "Although it is Catholic in its roots, we've found that Christians of all denominations experience this devotional concert as especially moving," said Katie Alexander, the choir's director.

Former director, Paige Byrne Shortal, wrote the narration for this concert and it's been offered every year since 1997. "We're especially pleased to be singing at Holy Redeemer where Fr. Kevin Schmittgens is the pastor. "Fr. Kevin is an old friend of our choir and well-known as not only a fine preacher, but as someone with theatre background. He's agreed to narrate the concert and I'm looking forward to hearing his interpretation." Shortal will serve as co-director for this concert.

"This concert is a favorite of our choir members," said Shortal. "There is a song to reflect on each of the fourteen stations. For example, *Pieta* by Tom Kendzia, the song for the fourth station when Jesus meets his mother as he is carrying his cross, is sung from the mother's point of view: 'Come and see what I have done, I've given my only son,' she cries." The concert includes both traditional and contemporary music.

The choir is accompanied by pianist, Lucy Tobben and the concert will be interpreted for the deaf by Torri Ryder. "Her work is a lovely, graceful addition and both deaf and hearing members of the congregation enjoy her ministry," said Alexander.

Lenten Offering: Making Haiti Green Again

This year's Lenten Offering will support an initiative by the Smallholder Farmers Alliance to promote reforestation and sustainable agriculture in St. Jean du Sud, our twinned parish. The goal of the 5-year program is to improve food production and to plant 75,000 trees, most of them fruit and nut trees, to help stabilize the soil and provide an additional source of income for the 400 participating farmers. In exchange for planting and caring for the trees, farmers receive farming tools, highquality black bean and pigeon pea seeds, training in sustainable farming practices, and access to a seed bank cooperative. 

An abortion rights group recently <u>filed eleven initiative petitions</u> with the Secretary of State's office to provide protections for the procedure in the state constitution. The proposals, filed by a political action committee called Missourians for Constitutional Freedom, would amend the constitution to declare that the "government shall not infringe upon a person's fundamental right to reproductive freedom."

Each proposal states that there must be "a compelling governmental interest" for abortion restrictions to be put in place; however, each differs as to the specifics of what is allowable. Regardless, the proposals would effectively roll back the current prolife protections in Missouri.

The Secretary of State's office is now accepting public comments on the 11 versions of the proposed amendment. The office will then write a summary and supporters can then begin gathering signatures to place the issue on the 2024 ballot."
