

PASTOR'S CORNER

Thoughts on Father's Day



I still remember exactly where we were when my father had "the talk" with my brother Tom and myself: driving on Watson Road between River Des Peres and Mackenzie. Dad was driving, I was riding shotgun and Tom was in the back seat.

From out of nowhere my father stated emphatically: If either of

you boys got a girl pregnant... (I shot a look at Tom as if to say: What did you do? He shot one back: Me? You're the wild one!) My father continued: ...I would not expect you to marry her, but I would expect you to take financial responsibility for the child.

And that was it. End of lecture. We drove home the rest of the way in silence. (At least, that's how I remember it.)

If you get one and only one "the talk" I don't think you can get more succinct or spot on than my father's version. He didn't want us to make a rash decision that might totally alter our lives and possibly ruin the life of several others. Yet, he wanted us to know, in no uncertain terms, that our actions had consequences and a real man takes responsibility for those actions. He let us know that there would be repercussions from our romantic exploits and although we shouldn't compound the problem, we would need to live up to our economic responsibility.

It worked. Neither of us had to deal with this issue. And I often think that if other fathers would have this exact same discussion with their sons, how much better our world would be.

My father was not perfect. In fact, he had many flaws and quirks. As I may have mentioned before in church, he was banished from practically every Catholic sports field in South County. (It was at my nephews' games. I wasn't much of an athlete.) He had a temper, but he was not abusive, either physically or verbally.

But besides teaching me how to be moral, he taught me much about life, about finances, about faith and most of all, how to be a good man. The way we knew he had died is that he didn't show up for morning Mass as he always did. He was a veteran of World War II (Army Air Corps), serving proudly in the CBI (China, Burma, India) theatre of operations. (Survival tip: if you are lost in the jungle without any food, watch what the monkeys eat, and if the monkeys don't eat, eat the monkeys. I never had to actually use this knowledge, thankfully.) When we built our Parish Center at Neier and I had plunged that little parish into \$900,000 of debt, it was my father's advice (no matter how much you are in debt, as long as you are trying, they will leave you alone) that echoed in my heart. I credit him for helping me get my finances in order. (Believe it or not, I used to be somewhat scatterbrained about it.)

And I credit him (and my mom, of course) with establishing my faith. Our evening meal prayer rivaled a novena. We prayed for everyone, living and dead. He forced me to go to our block rosary on Monday evenings. (Hated it at 12, appreciate it deeply at 65.) His faith was lively, real, down-to-earth and authentic.

Today we remember our fathers. If your father is alive, thank him. If he has passed to the next life, thank Almighty God. If your relationship with your father was or is strained, pray for healing. If it is beyond that even that, pray for a peaceful heart. I am eternally grateful for my dad's influence in my life and in the life of my siblings. I can only hope to live up to his standards.

HR HAITI COMMITTEE "SPONSOR-A-STUDENT PROGRAM" 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR



Chairman's Statement on Dobbs Anniversary

June 24, 2023, marks the one-year anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, and we have much to celebrate. By the grace of God, the nearly fifty-year reign of national abortion on demand has been put to an end. *Roe v. Wade*—a seemingly insurmountable blight on our nation—is no more! This is a day for continued joy and for gratitude; a day to recall the countless faithful laborers who have dedicated themselves to prayer, action, witness, and service in support of the cause of life; and a day to thank God for His unending faithfulness.

Even as we celebrate, we are reminded that this is not the *end*, but the *beginning* of a critical new phase in our efforts to protect human life. Despite this momentous legal victory, sobering and varied challenges lie ahead of us. Over the past year, while some states have acted to protect preborn children, others have tragically moved to enshrine abortion in law—enacting extreme abortion policies that leave children vulnerable to abortion, even until the moment of birth.

In this shifting political landscape, we persist confidently in our efforts to defend life. The work that lies ahead continues to be not just changing laws but also helping to change hearts, with steadfast faith in the power of God to do so. The task before us begins with our knowledge of the truth and our courage to *speak* it and to *live* it with compassion.

Each of us is called to radical solidarity with women facing an unexpected or challenging pregnancy. That means doing whatever we can to provide them with the care and support they need to welcome their children. I thank the millions of individual Catholics who are already personally living out this Gospel call through parish and community initiatives like Walking with Moms in Need.

We must likewise extend a compassionate hand to all who are suffering in the aftermath of participation in abortion. The Church continues to share Christ's healing and infinite mercy with women and men through diocesan Project Rachel Ministries.

As we each consider how we are uniquely called to build a culture of life, I invite you to join a growing community of Catholics who have subscribed to Respect Life Prayer and Action. When you sign up, you will receive prayers, alerts to contact Congress and government leaders on important legislation, and ways to strengthen a culture of life in your community. You can sign up today at respectlife.org/prayer-and-action.

May all people of faith and good will work together to proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence.
