

As you may know, a pro-abortion group is attempting to enshrine a right to abortion in the Missouri constitution. Their effort would nullify most of the protections for unborn children and their mothers that pro-lifers have worked so hard to place in Missouri statute. Their measure would allow for unlimited abortions for the full nine months of pregnancy for girls of any age without parental consent and allow for non-medical personnel to perform abortions. Missouri was the first state to ban abortions after the Dobbs decision overturned Roe v. Wade.
